

REVIEW – TOOWOOMBA TURF CLUB – SATURDAY JULY 12, 2008

Race 1 – Genesys Wealth Advisors Maiden Handicap 1000 metres: COMMIZARATIONS (g3 Zariz-Miss Comanche-Opera Prince) 1, Girls Aloud (f3 Sequalo-Eat Like Crazy-Devorant) 2, Bumper Harvest (f3 High Yield USA-So Inspired NZ-Green Perfume USA) 3.

A head front-running ride by apprentice Skye Bogenhuber set the scene for a breakthrough win for **Commizarations** (\$1.80).

Commizarations attracted solid support after finishing second in two previous runs at Clifford Park on June 7 and 28.

He appreciated Bogenhuber's three kilograms allowance, which reduced the weight **Commizarations** had to carry to 55 kilograms.

Commizarations beat Girls Aloud (\$10, Garry Hoobin) by one length and there was another one and a quarter lengths to the third placed Bumper Harvest (\$6, Brent Evans).

Race 2 – Lanes Interiors/That Kids Room QTIS Two-Years-Old Handicap 1000 metres: LADY LESIA (f2 Iglesia-Matahoom-Squill USA) 1, Dusty Moon (c2 Moon Rocket Jpn-Zaozip-Zephyr Zip NZ) 2, Rocket Gal (f2 Moon Rocket Jpn-Country Strike NZ-Straight Strike USA) 3.

It was a case of favourite does best when **Lady Lesia** (\$2.50, Sky Bogenhuber) scored easily.

Lady Lesia was having her fifth run and made it look easy as she powered to the line one and a half lengths clear of the others.

Lady Lesia bounced out of the gates and zoomed to the front, leading from Golden Flute, Regal Prince, Don'tstop Believin, Rock Rave, Marybelle and French Silver.

Just before the turn **Lady Lesia** skipped away and strode to the line.

Race 3 – JD Dodds Property Valuers Class 2 Handicap 1000 metres: SAPHIRA (f3 Lion Hunter-Generella-Grand Lodge USA) 1, Final Opinion (g4 Legal Opinion-Final Road-Sea Road) 2, Pinszah (f3 Zaha Can-Serendipity Snip-Snippets) 3.

Winner **Saphira** is averaging more than \$2000 in earnings every start.

When **Saphira** (\$6, Melanie Price) landed her third win, beating Final Opinion (\$13, Nathan Thomas) by three-quarters of a length, she picked up \$6500 in prizemoney.

This lifted her money haul to more than \$35,000 from three wins and five placings in 15 starts.

Final Opinion ran an even race to finish in second spot, a short neck in front of Pinszah (\$7, Renee Hinricks).

Race 4 – Qld Choice Class 1 Handicap 1600 metres: Bloody Quick (h4 Dracula-Petty-Brief Truce USA) 1, Tuscany Affair (g5 Tuscany Flyer-Blazing Courtship NZ-Personal Escort USA) 2, Seven Freddie's (c3 Seven Figures USA-Novajinsky-Celestial Dancer Ire) 3.

A never-say-die attitude carried the day for **Bloody Quick** (\$3.80, Brent Evans).

Bloody Quick was always in a threatening spot after a good beginning.

He settled down in fifth spot behind Roamin' Off, Zannipour, Cachaca and My First Lady.

Near the 1200 metres Cachaca took over the front-running and My First Lady also made her move, zipping up into second spot.

Evans, however, was content to stay put and **Bloody Quick** poked along in fifth position.

Bloody Quick inched forward as the field approached the turn but he still had plenty of work to do.

Tuscany Affair (\$13, Amy Taylor) and Seven Freddie's (\$9, Scott Richardson) chimed in with big runs and were being hailed as potential winners.

But **Bloody Quick** would not be denied and he kept chipping away before hitting the front in the shadows of the post to win by a half length. There was a short half head between Tuscany Affair and Seven Freddie's, which finished second and third respectively.

Race 5 – Bank of Qld Limited Class 4 Handicap 1300 metres: TISANI BOY (g3 Immoveable Option Ire-Clear Run-Scenic Ire) 1, Strawberry Sky (m4 Hurricane Sky-Dolcetto-Canny Lad) 2, Templin (g7 Ascot Knight Can-Our Forte NZ-Kreisler Ire) 3.

Emerging Star Tisano Boy (\$1.90, Brent Evans) has kept an unbeaten record intact.

Tisani Boy made his debut at Clifford Park on May 31 and won with plenty of authority. He repeated the dose when he stepped up to Class 1 company on June 21 and he has stretched his winning sequence to three when he finished with a wet sail.

Tisani Boy was given the run of the race in fourth spot behind Gold King, Protest Vote and Who Can It Be Now before slipped into overdrive in the early stages of the home straight.

He bounded to the front with about 200 metres to run and raced away to win untroubled by more than two lengths.

Strawberry Sky (\$5, Kenji Yoshida) showed a return to form with a solid effort to take second spot, one length in front of third placegetter Templin (\$26, Skye Bogenhuber).

Race 6 – Finlay Developments Class 1 Handicap 1300 metres: OCHO RIOS (g4 Octagonal NZ-Regina Madre-Bletchingly) 1, Grande Vargue (g4 Canadian Silver Can-Tsunami-Seattle Siesta USA) 2, Crystal Gayza (g6 Waterford Road-Gayza Lady-Knighthood NZ) 3.

Former Sydney campaigner **Ocho Rios** (\$5, Renee Hinricks) made an impressive Queensland debut with a smart victory.

Ocho Rios was prepared in Sydney by Steve Englebrecht for a win and two placings in 13 runs before being transferred north.

Having his first outing for the Col Williamson stake, **Ocho Rios** proved a bit too good to win from Grande Vargue (\$5, Amy Taylor) and Crystal Gayza (\$21, Brent Evans).

Race 7 – Lenz Jensen Lawyers Maiden Handicap 1300 metres: CONTOURS (c3 Skalato-Molineta NZ-Star Board NZ) 1, Lady Hemingway (f3 Hemingway Ire-Stint-Night Shift USA) 2, Miss Bellissima (f3 Arazi USA-Bellatu-Barathea Ire) 3.

Apprentice Skye Bogenhuber will remember the meeting for quite a while after sealing a winning treble aboard the topweight **Contours** (\$15).

Bogenhuber won the opening two events on the card with Commizarations and Lady Lesia and rode aggressively to complete the treble.

Contours was in the second half of the field for most of the race and looked to have almost no hope once the runners swung into the home straight.

Miss Bellissima (\$6, Adam Best) appeared likely to win after dashing to the front soon after entering the straight. She has raced well after beginning nicely and settling in fourth before moving up to second at the halfway mark.

Then Lady Hemingway (\$6, Renee Hinricks) arrived on the scene and put paid to Miss Bellissima's winning hopes.

But no sooner had Lady Hemingway's supporters started to smile than **Contours** burst out of the ruck and nailed Lady Hemingway in the last few bounds to win by a long neck.
